

FAQ on UNSW Double Degree Program

Q1. How to apply?

1. Registration:

Register to the department your willingness to attend the program before the adding and dropping period every semester.

2. Application Deadline:

2nd semester of 2nd year (Before June 30) or 1st semester of 3rd year (Before Oct 30)

3. Procedure: Submit the transcripts and English certificate to the department before the deadline. Students who are qualified will get the recommendation letter from the Dean of College of Engineering. After getting the recommendation letter, the student needs to apply for entering UNSW on their admission website (around the end of July or November).

4. Study at UNSW:

Students who apply in the 2nd semester of 2nd year will go to UNSW in the first semester of junior year.

Students who apply in the 1st semester of 3rd year will go to UNSW in the second semester of junior year.

Q2. How much is the tuition fee?

Students enrolled in the Taiwan Tech-UNSW Agreement will be required to pay the international student tuition fees for the Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) at UNSW and the Bachelor of Science at Taiwan Tech at the time of and during the enrolment of the student. (Around 85,000 AUD / per year)

Q3. Courses I need to take at Taiwan Tech

Students are suggested finishing the courses indicated in the slides. After taking the courses at Taiwan Tech, students may waive the courses at UNSW and pay less credit fees when studying at UNSW.

Q4. Courses I need to take at UNSW

Please consult with your own department to confirm what courses you need to take at UNSW to waive the credits of junior and senior year at Taiwan Tech.

Q5. What is the application qualification?

1. Bachelor's Degree students under College of Engineering

2. Study at Taiwan Tech with a minimum GPA of 2.8 out of 4.3
3. English certificate IELTS: 6.5, min. 6.0 in each subtest
TOFEL: 90, min. 23 in writing, 22 in reading, listening and speaking
4. Students are suggested taking EMI courses when studying at Taiwan Tech in the first two years.

Q6. Is there a quota limit?

No. However, UNSW has the final right to refuse to admit applicants.
